Landscape is committed to continual improvement and reduction of the environmental impact of the business, as an employer, as a supplier and as a contributor to the wider community. It is our policy to comply with all existing environmental legislation which is relevant to our business, and indeed, wherever possible to exceed legislative expectations where possible.

Energy Consumption / Efficiency

- Landscape encourages the efficient use of energy, and where cost effective the use of renewable energy and 'green' electricity suppliers.
- We replace equipment with energy efficient models as and when they are needed to be replaced
- We ensure that all computers, printers and lighting is turned off when not in use

Transport

- We have reduced the of dependence of carbon fuelled transport, thus minimising the imprint of the business
- Encourage use of the public transport network wherever possible for deliveries, to attend meetings or to travel to and from work
- Encourage flexible working, thus further reducing the transport impact of our employees.

Waste Minimisation / Recycling

- Ensuring minimum use of office printers as standard practice,
- Use 80GSM instead of 100 GSM paper
- Print settings on fast draft, greyscale and print to both sides

Marketing / Publicity

- Using energy efficient methods to interact and communicate with clients and suppliers. Including electronic marketing and publicity as the standard communication tool, thus reducing the use of printed matter.

Sustainable Purchasing

- To endeavour to purchase from suppliers who can demonstrate that their goods are supplied using sustainable sources.
- Actively try to source FSC accredited paper stock & printers where possible for all our print
- Landscape seeks to partner with ISO accredited printers

Education
